Note: The use of letters such as *C* and *D* or numbers such as 5,6 and 7 indicate the amount of space between the tip-rail and the reed-tip. This space is often called the <u>tip-opening</u> or <u>lay</u> of the mouthpiece. The addition of a star or asterisk (*) after a letter or the increase in number or progression through the alphabet indicates a wider or larger tip-opening.

Each mouthpiece manufacturer has it's own numbering and/or lettering system that determines the facing and tip opening. This will obviously affect the quality of sound (dark-bright), resonance of sound, response and of course the choice of both the strength and brand of the reed. In general, the following table outlines three major brands of classical mouthpieces:
